ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES - TUESDAY, DECEMBER 12 4 pm

Susan opened the meeting with prayer.

Minutes from the November 9, 2023, meeting were read; no corrections were noted. Motion to approve by Janice, 2nd by Deb; motion passed.

FINANCE REPORT - Jeff used his time this month to go over two of the reports that he provides every month to the Council. He reviewed the "Monthly Actuals Detail Report" and the "Month & YTD Actuals vs. Budget" report. He explained the purpose of each report and how to read the information in each one.

Balance in the Guatemalan student account through December 5, 2023, is \$1195.24. Motion by Kirk to accept the report, 2nd by Janice; motion passed.

There was discussion about having a class to assist new members in joining our church. The council chaired the discussion for now and will bring it up again after the first of the year.

The group reviewed the scholarship application that will be used for the Maxwell Family Educational Scholarship. It was decided that letters of recommendation for the student are strongly recommended but not mandatory. Gene will make changes to the application and have the group review it one more time before print.


